In pursuance of its functions under the above mentioned Act the Dublin County Council, being the Planning Authority for the County Health District of Dublin, did by order <u>P/957/66</u> dated Upth Oct. Der, 1900 make a decision pursuant to Section 26(1) of the Act refusing permission for:

Detac ed bungalow on Site B13, Whitehall Cross Estate

for the following reason: -

- (1) That The proposed bungalow over100 3 site 814 and would thus result in seriously injury to the amenity of that bungalow site.
