NOTIFICATION OF A DECISION ON AN APPLICATION FOR A PERMISSION
LOCAL GOVERNMENT (PLANNING AND DEVELOPMENT) ACT, 1963.

TO Hubert Fahy, Esq., Reference No. in Planning Register of

Lucan, Co. DUBLIN. Application received 22nd July, 1966.
APPLICANT Hubert Fahy.

In pursuance of its functions under the above mentioned Act the Dublin County Council, being the Planning Authority for the County Health District of Dublin, did by order P/800/66 dated 12 September, 1966. make a decision pursuant to Section 26(1) of the Act to grant a permission for:

Bungalow at Fonthill, Lucan.

subject to the following conditions:-

- (1) That the development be carried out and completed in strict conformity with the plans and specification lodged with the application, save as is in the conditions hereunder otherwise required.
- (2) That the line of the Council's main Lucan Road (T3) Improvement Proposal, which affected the site, be set out and checked to the satisfaction of the County Engineer prior to the commencement of any work in connection with the proposal.
- (3) That the existing dwelling and all other out buildings at present existing in front of the proposal be removed from the site, as agreed, when the new bungalow is erected as the site would be inadequate to suitably contain these existing structures in addition to the proposed new bungalow.
- (4) That the external finishes, including the roof, harmonise in colour and texture with the adjoining dwelling.
- (5) That detailed drawings of the front boundary wall and entrance gates be submitted to and approved by the Council before same are erected. (Conditions Nos. 4 & 5 refer to visual amenity).
- (6) That Building Bye-Laws approval shall be obtained and any conditions of such approval shall be observed in the development.

If there is no appeal to the Minister for Local Government against this decision, permission will be granted by the Council on the expiration of the period for the taking of such appeal. If every appeal made in accordance with the Act has been withdrawn, the Council will grant the permission as soon as may be after the withdrawal.

NOTE: An appeal against the decision may be made to the Minister by the applicant within one month from the date of receipt by the applicant of this notification or by any other person within twenty-one days of the date of the decision. The appeal shall be in writing and shall state the subject matter of the appeal and grounds of the appeal and the nature of the appellant's interest in the property affected and should be addressed to the Secretary, Department of Local Government, (Planning Appeals Section), Custom House, Dublin 1. When an appeal has been duly made and has not been withdrawn the Minister for Local Government will determine the application for permission as if it had been made to him in the first instance.

APPROVAL OF THE COUNCIL UNDER BUILDING BYE LAWS MUST BE OBTAINED BEFORE THE DEVELOPMENT IS COMMENCED AND THE TERMS OF APPROVAL MUST BE COMPLIED WITH IN THE CARRYING OUT OF THE WORK.
