APPEAL by C. Greaves, care of John Davies, 2, Skreen Road, Dublin against the decision made on the 14th day of May, 1982, by the Council of the County of Dublin to refuse permission for a development comprising the erection of an abattoir and the refurbishment of existing farm buildings on lands at Springfield, Glanamuck Road, Carrickmines, Dublin:

DECISION: Pursuant to the Local Government (Planning and Development) Acts, 1963 to 1982, permission is hereby refused for the said development for the reasons set out in the Schedule hereto.

SCHEDULE

1. The proposed development would be prejudicial to public health because of the inadequate provision for water supply and drainage disposal, having regard to the nature of the effluent and waste disposal problem arising from the proposed abattoir combined with the proposed use of the farm for breeding and rearing pigs for marketing.
2. The proposed development would endanger public safety by reason of traffic hazard because of the increased traffic turning movements on Glenamuck Road at its junction with the lane serving the site.

1. The proposal is unacceptable to the Sanitary Authority because of inadequate provision for water supply and drainage disposal, having regard to the nature of the effluent and waste disposal problem posed by the abattoir combined with the pig rearing and farming on the site. The development, if allowed would be prejudicial to public health.
2. The increased traffic generated by the proposed development would endanger public safety by reason of traffic hazard at the π π junction of the existing access laneway with Glenamuck Road.
