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In pursuance of its functions under the above mentioned Act the Dublin County Council, being the Planning Authority for the County Health District of Dublin, did by order <u>P/1652/66</u> dated <u>16th March 1967</u> make a decision pursuant to Section 26(1) of the Act to grant a permission for:

39 NV Station at Templeogue

subject to the following conditions:-

- (I) That the development be carried out and completed in strict conformity with the plans and specification lodged with the application.
- (2) That the necessary land be reserved for the Templeogue/Tallaght Road Improvement Scheme as indicated in blue colour on the attached C.P.452.
- (3) That the building line be in conformity with that established for this section of the Templeogue/Tallaght Road and not in advance of the adjoining dwellinghouses at the east side of the site proposed.
- (4) That Building Bye-laws approval shall be obtained and any conditions of such approval shall be observed in the development.

If there is no appeal to the Minister for Local Government against this decision, permission will be granted by the Council on the expiration of the period for the taking of such appeal. If every appeal made in accordance with the Act has been withdrawn, the Council will grant the permission as soon as may be after the withdrawal.

The appeal shall be in writing and shall state the subject matter of the appeal and grounds of the appeal and the nature of the appellant's interest in the property affected and should be addressed to the Secretary, Department of Local Government, (Flanning Appeals Section), Custom House, Dublin 1. When an appeal has been duly made and has not been withdrawn the Minister for Local Government will determine the application for permission as if it had been made to him in the first instance.
