In pursuance of its functions under the above mentioned Act the Dublin County Council, being the Planning Authority for the County Health District of Dublin, did by order P/670/66 dated 10th August '66 make a decision pursuant to Section 26 (1) of the Act refusing outline permission for: Petrol filling station at Oldbawn, Tallaght

for the following reasons:-

- (1) The erection of a petrol filling station on this site, in close proximity to Killinurey Cross, would create a serious traffic hazard by reason of additional vehicle movements near the junction of Firhouse Road with Oldbawn Road/Oldcourt Road.
- (2) A portion of the site is affected by the Council's Road Improvement Scheme for Oldcourt Road/Oldbawn Road and Firhouse Road.
- (3) Piped drainage services are not available to serve the proposal.

NOTE: An appeal against the decision may be made to the Minister by the applicant within one month from the date of receipt by the applicant of this notification or by any other person within twenty-one days of the date of the decision. The appeal shall be in writing and shall state the subject matter of the appeal and grounds of the appeal and the nature of the applicant's interest in the property affected and should be addressed to the Secretary, Department of Local Government, (Planning Appeals Section), Custom House, Dublin. 1. When an appeal has been duly made and has not been withdrawn the Minister for Local Government will determine the application for outline permission as if it had been made to him in the first instance.
