NOTIFICATION OF A DECISION ON AN APPLICATION FOR A PERMISSION

APPLICANT Supatone (Eire) Ltd.,

In pursuance of its functions under the above mentioned Act the Dublin
County Council, being the Planning Authority for the County Health District
of Dublin, did by order P/644/66 dated 11th August 1966 make a
decision pursuant to Section 26(1) of the Act to grant a permission for:
Housing Development etc. at Butterfield Avenue, (Rathfarnham Golf Course)

subject to the following conditions:- (1) to (8)

- (1) That the development be carried out and completed in strict conformity with the plans and specification lodged with the application.
- (2) That the roads, sewers, watermains and other services shown on the plans or required for the development be constructed in accordance with the County Council specification and requirements for such services.
- (3) That the alignment and levels of the proposed ring road be set out by an official of the County Council before any constructional work takes place.
- (4) Cognisance should be taken, in the setting out and alignment of this ring road and the over-all development, of the Council's proposal to lay a main trunk sewer through the site. For this purpose a wayleave will be required by the Council which should be provided for by the developer (particulars of the location and other details of this trunk sewer can be obtained from the Sanitary Services Section of the County Engineer's Department).
- (5) No building line to be less than 30-ft from the road boundary.
- (6) That additional tree-planting be provided at the rear of the shopping centre and filling stations so as to enhance their appearance from the Springfield residential development viewpoint.
- (7) That Building Bye-Laws approval shall be obtained and any conditions of such approval shall be observed in the development.
- (8) See overleaf.

If there is no appeal to the Minister for Local Government against this decision, permission will be granted by the Council on the expiration of the period for the taking of such appeal. If every appeal made in accordance with the Act has been withdrawn, the Council will grant the permission as soon as may be after the withdrawal.

NOTE: An appeal against the decision may be made to the Minister by the applicant within one month from the date of receipt by the applicant of this notification or by any other person within twenty-one days of the date of the decision. The appeal shall be in writing and shall state the subject matter of the appeal and grounds of the appeal and the nature of the appellant's interest in the property affected and should be addressed to the Secretary, Department of Local Government, (Planning Appeals Section), Custom House, Dublin 1. When an appeal has been duly made and has not been withdrawn the Minister for Local Government will determine the application for permission as if it had been made to him in the first instance.

APPROVAL OF THE COUNCIL UNDER BUILDING BYE LAWS MUST BE OBTAINED BEFORE THE DEVELOPMENT IS COMMENCED AND THE TERMS OF APPROVAL MUST BE COMPLIED WITH IN THE CARRYING OUT OF THE WORK.

(8) That the Bond of an Insurance Company in the sum of £3000 conditioned for the provision and completion of services, of roads and footpaths, sewers, watermains open spaces and landscaping for the development for which permission may be granted pursuant to this decision, be obtained and lodged with the County Council before any development under such permission commences.
