NOTIFICATION OF A DECISION REFUSING PERMISSION.
LOCAL GOVERNMENT (PLANNING AND DEVELOPMENT) ACT, 1963

APPLICANT

In pursuance of its functions under the above mentioned Act the Dublin County Council, being the Planning Authority for the County Health District of Dublin, did by order F/857/66 dated 26 Sept. 1966 make a decision pursuant to Section 26(1) of the Act refusing permission for:

Petrol ~~ix~~ service station and service and sales garage at Ballymount Lane.

for the following reasons:-

- (1) The proposal would endanger public safety by reason of traffic hazard and obstruction of road users on account of (a) its location directly abutting the junction of an existing factory estate road with Ballymount Lane and (b) the inadequate size of the site.
- (2) The applicants have failed, even though notified previously by the Planning Authority in regard to the matter in letter dated 30th June, 1966, to provide and maintain a proper site notice in accordance with Article 8 (5) of the Local Government (Planning and Development) Act, 1963, (Permission) Regulations.

NOTE: An appeal against the decision may be made to the Minister by the applicant within one month from the date of receipt by the applicant of this notification or by any other person within twenty-one days of the date of the decision. The appeal shall be in writing and shall state the subject matter of the appeal and grounds of the appeal and the nature of the appellant's interest in the property affected and should be addressed to the Secretary (Planning Appeals Section) Department of Local Government, Custom House, Dublin 1. When an appeal has been duly made and has not been withdrawn the Minister for Local Government will determine the application for permission as if it had been made to him in the first instance.
