In pursuance of its functions under the above mentioned Act the Dublin County Council, being the Planning Authority for the County Health District of Dublin, did by order P/433/66 dated 16th June 1966 make a decision pursuant to Section 26(1) of the Act refusing permission for:

Restaurant at Castle Crescent, Monastery Road, Clondalkin  
for the following reasons:-

- (1) The off-street car parking space provided for in the proposal is unsatisfactory with regard to location, extent and access.
- (2) Due to the absence of satisfactory off-street car parking provision the proposal would result in injury to the amenity of the area.
- (3) The site plan does not show existing site conditions (e.g. width of rear service lane, existing accesses thereto and residential development at the rear, etc.) satisfactorily and its scale is not indicated.

NOTE: An appeal against the decision may be made to the Minister by the applicant within one month from the date of receipt by the applicant of this notification or by any other person within twenty-one days of the date of the decision. The appeal shall be in writing and shall state the subject matter of the appeal and grounds of the appeal and the nature of the appellant's interest in the property affected and should be addressed to the Secretary (Planning Appeals Section) Department of Local Government, Custom House, Dublin 1. When an appeal has been duly made and has not been withdrawn the Minister for Local Government will determine the application for permission as if it had been made to him in the first instance.
