APPLICANT

In pursuance of its functions under the above mentioned Act the Dublin County Council, being the Planning Authority for the County, South District of Dublin, did by order P/401/66 dated 8th June 1966 make a decision pursuant to Section 26 (1) of the Act to grant an ~~outline~~ permission for:

Extension at No. 1, Hillsbrook Drive, Ferrystown

subject to the following conditions:-

- (1) That the development be carried out and completed in strict conformity with the plans and specification lodged with the application, save as is in the conditions hereunder otherwise required.
- (2) That the external finishes harmonise in colour and texture with the existing dwelling. (This requirement refers to visual amenity).
- (3) That Building Bye-Laws approval shall be obtained and any conditions of approval be observed in the development.

Approval of the Council under Building Bye-Laws must be obtained before the development is commenced and the terms of approval must be complied with in the carrying out of the work.

If there is no appeal to the Minister for Local Government against this decision, ~~outline~~ permission will be granted by the Council on the expiration of the period for the taking of such appeal. If any appeal made in accordance with the Act has been withdrawn, the Council will grant the ~~outline~~ permission as soon as may be after the withdrawal.

**NOTE:** An appeal against the decision may be made to the Minister by the applicant within one month from the date of receipt by the applicant of this notification or by any other person within twenty-one days of the date of the decision. The appeal shall be in writing and shall state the subject matter of the appeal and grounds of the appeal and the nature of the appellant's interest in the property affected and should be addressed to the Secretary, Department of Local Government, Custom House, Dublin 1. When an appeal has been duly made and has not been ~~withdrawn~~, the Minister for Local Government will determine the application for ~~outline~~ permission as if it has been made to him in the first instance.
