Dwallinghouses on site Nos. 165 and 166, Rosemount Estate, Rathfornham

subject to the following conditions -

- (I) That the development be carried out and completed in strict conformity with the plans and specification lodged with the application.
- (2) That the roads, severs, watermains and other services shown on the plans or required for the development be constructed in accordance with the County Council specification for such services.
- (3) That the houses be set back not less than 30' from the road boundary.
- (4) That the external finish, including the roofs, harmonise in colour and texture with the adjoining development. (This requirement refers to visual emenity).
- (5) That Building Bye-Lews approval shall be obtained and any conditions of such approval shill be observed in the development.

Approval of the Council under Building Bye Laws must be obtained before the Development is commenced and the terms of approval must be complied with in the carrying out of the work.

If there is no appeal to the Minister for Local Government against this decision, optimer permission will be granted by the Council on the expiration of the period for the taking of such appeal. If overy appeal made in accordance with the Act has been withdrawn, the Council will grant the **introduce** permission as soon as may be after the withdrawal.
