In pursuance of its functions under the above mentioned Act the Dublin County Council, being the Planning Authority for the County Health District of Dublin, did by order P/127/66 dated 22/4/1966 make a decision pursuant to Section 26(1) of the Act to grant a permission for:

Sixteen No. Dwellings on site Nos. 54 to 69 (inclusive) Thomastown Road,

Dolton Estate,

subject to the following conditions:-

- (1) That the development be carried out and completed in strict conformity with the plans and specification lodged with the application.
- (2) That the roads, sewers, watermain and other services shown on the plans or required for the development be constructed in accordance with the County Council specification for such services.
- (3) That the external finish, including the roofs, harmonize in colour and texture with the adjoining development.
(This requirement refers to visual amenity).
- (4) That Building Bye Laws approval shall be obtained and any conditions of such approval shall be observed in the development.

If there is no appeal to the Minister for Local Government against this decision, permission will be granted by the Council on the expiration of the period for the taking of such appeal. If every appeal made in accordance with the Act has been withdrawn, the Council will grant the permission as soon as may be after the withdrawal.
