NOTIFICATION OF A DECISION REFUSING OUTLINE PERMISSION
LOCAL GOVERNMENT (PLANNING AND DEVELOPMENT) ACT, 1963.

APPLICANT S. Byrne

In pursuance of its functions under the above mentioned Act the Dublin County Council, being the Planning Authority for the County Health District of Dublin, did by order TR/2937/65 dated 25/2/1966 make a decision pursuant to Section 26 (1) of the Act refusing outline permission for: Petrol Filling station at No. 14, Crumlin Village

for the following reasons:-

- (1) The proposal would cause an obstruction to traffic and tend to create serious traffic congestion in a busy shopping area.
- (2) The proposal would infringe an existing building line.
- (3) The proposal would be injurious to the amenity of a shopping area.
- (4) The proposal would constitute a traffic hazard.
- (5) The site is inadequate to contain suitably the proposal.

NOTE: An appeal against the decision may be made to the Minister by the applicant within one month from the date of receipt by the applicant of this notification or by any other person within twenty-one days of the date of the decision. The appeal shall be in writing and shall state the subject matter of the appeal and grounds of the appeal and the nature of the appellant's interest in the property affected and should be addressed to the Secretary, Department of Local Government, (Planning Appeals Section), Custom House, Dublin 1. When an appeal has been duly made and has not been withdrawn the Minister for Local Government will determine the application for outline permission as if it had been made to him in the first instance.
