In pursuance of its functions under the above mentioned Act the Dublin County Council, being the Planning Authority for the County Health District of Dublin, did by order P/11/66 dated 6/1/66 make a decision pursuant to Section 26(1) of the Act to grant a permission for:

Alterations and additions to No.3 Main Street, Clonsilla

subject to the following conditions:-

- (1) That the development be carried out and completed in strict conformity with the plans and specification lodged with the application.
- (2) That the external finish harmonise in colour and texture with the adjoining buildings. (This requirement refers to visual amenity).
- (3) That building Bye-Laws approval shall be obtained and any conditions of such approval shall be observed in the development.

If there is no appeal to the Minister for Local Government against this decision, permission will be granted by the Council on the expiration of the period for the taking of such appeal. If every appeal made in accordance with the Act has been withdrawn, the Council will grant the permission as soon as may be after the withdrawal.
