APPEAL by Massey Brothers (Funerals) Limited, of 129, Thomas Street, Dublin, against the decision made on the 16th day of December, 1981, by the Council of the County of Dublin, deciding to refuse permission for development comprising the continuance of use of a supermarket as a funeral home and the retention of an illuminated sign and clock at Templeogue Village, Dublin:

DECISION: Pursuant to the Local Government (Planning and Development) Acts, 1963 and 1976, permission is hereby refused for the said development for the reasons set out in the Schedule hereto.

SCHEDULE

The proposed development endangers public safety by reason of traffic hazard because it generates an unacceptable level of roadside parking on the adjoining heavily trafficked and substandard Templeogue Road and is thereby contrary to the proper planning and development of the area.

For **Proposed retention of change of use from supermarket to Funeral Homes and retention of unauthorized illuminated signs at front and gable elevations and clock sign at Templeogue Village, Dublin 6.**
for the following reasons:

1. The proposed development would endanger public safety by reason of traffic hazard due to the generation of an unacceptable amount of roadside parking on the heavily trafficked Templeogue Road (N.81) at Templeogue Village.
2. There is no provision for off-street car parking to serve the proposed development as required by the provisions of the County Development Plan. The proposal would therefore be contrary to the proper planning and development of the area.
