APPEAL by Irish Distillers Limited of Robinhood Road, Fox and Geese, County Dublin against the decision made on the 13th day of October, 1981, by the Council of the County of Dublin deciding to refuse to grant permission for the erection of two identification sign boards at Naas Road, Fox and Geese, County Dublin in accordance with plans and particulars lodged with the said Council:

DECISION: Pursuant to the Local Government (Planning and Development) Acts, 1963 and 1976, it is hereby decided, for the reasons set out in the First Schedule hereto, to grant permission for the erection of the said sign boards in accordance with the said plans and particulars, subject to the condition specified in column 1 of the Second Schedule hereto, the reason for the imposition of the said conditions being as set out in column 2 of the said Second Schedule and the said permission is hereby granted subject to the said condition.

FIRST SCHEDULE

It is accepted that signs are necessary to identify the location of the entrance to the appellant's premises, and provided the condition set out in the Second Schedule hereto is satisfactorily complied with, it is considered that the erection of two identification sign boards in the positions shown on the lodged plan would not compete with statutory road signs or be otherwise objectionable.
