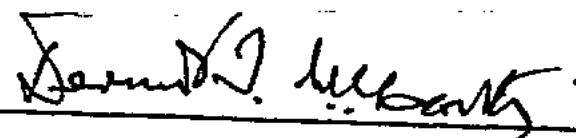

APPEAL by P. O'Boyle of 49, Walnut Close, Kingswood Heights, Clondalkin, County Dublin, against the decision made on the 30th day of September, 1981, by the Council of the County of Dublin deciding to refuse permission for the retention of a garage access at the rear of 49, Walnut Close, Kingswood Heights, Clondalkin, County Dublin onto Ballymount Road:

DECISION: Pursuant to the Local Government (Planning and Development) Acts, 1963 and 1976, permission is hereby refused for the retention of the said garage access for the reason set out in the Schedule hereto.

SCHEDULE

The proposed development would endanger public safety by reason of traffic hazard because it would generate additional traffic-turning movements on the adjoining inadequate and substandard heavily-trafficked Ballymount Road.
