

APPEAL by Messrs Sorohan Builders care of Conroy Manahan & Associates, Maryland House, 20-21, St. William Street, Dublin, against the decision made on the 3rd day of September, 1981, by the Council of the County of Dublin, deciding to refuse permission for the retention of an advertising structure on a site at St. Mary's College, Templeville Road, Dublin:

DECISION: Pursuant to the Local Government (Planning and Development) Acts, 1963 and 1976, ~~permission is hereby refused~~ for the retention of the said advertising structure for the reason set out in the Schedule hereto.

SCHEDULE

By reason of its size, obtrusiveness and location on private recreational land, the retention of the advertising structure would be seriously injurious to the amenities of properties in the vicinity and thereby contrary to the proper planning and development of the area.
