- 1. It is an objective of the planning authority as expressed in the Dublin County Development Plan to preserve the area in which the land is located as one of high amenity. This objective is considered reasonable and the proposed development would conflict with it and be seriously injurious to the amenities of the area.
- 2. The proposed development would endanger public safety by reason of traffic hazard as it would generate additional heavy vehicular movements on the existing inadequate road network in the area.
- 3. The proposed development would be likely to lead to pollution of waters in the catchment area of the River Dodder and would therefore be prejudicial to public health.

With reference to your planning application received here on 15th May, 1981 in connection with the above, I wish to inform you that before the application can be considered under the Local Government (Planning and Development) Acts, 1963 and 1976 the following additional information must be submitted in quadruplicate :-

1. A working drawing showing existing and finished contours for the area where the proposed quarrying activities are to take place.

2. A geological and hydrogeological survey of the proposed quarrying site shouldbe carried out and the resultant data should be submitted with plans and sections of thesiste.

3. A general description of the "infill materials" - which the applicant intends to use to reclaim the worked out quarry - to innaude : (a)natnature (solid?, liquid) etc.) (b) appearance (colour etc) and give a detailed descrippion of the process/activity which give rise to this


