

APPEAL by Joe Mooney, of Mellifont House, Collon, County Louth, against the decision made on the 20th day of January, 1981, by the Council of the County of Dublin, deciding to refuse to grant a permission for development on a site at Naas Road described as the retention of existing buildings and the use of the site for machinery sales and service:

DECISION: Pursuant to the Local Government (Planning and Development) Acts, 1963 and 1976, permission is hereby refused for the said development for the reason set out in the Schedule hereto.

SCHEDULE

The proposed development would endanger public safety by reason of traffic hazard because the site adjoins the heavily-trafficked Dublin-Naas dual carriageway national primary road (N7) and the additional traffic movements of heavy commercial vehicles into and out of the site together with the possible parking of vehicles on the hard shoulder of the dual carriageway immediately adjacent to the site would interfere with the safety and free flow of traffic on the said road.
