APPEAL by Axxon Waste Disposal Limited, of Walkinstown Avenue, Walkinstown, County Dublin against the decision made on the 1st day of October, 1979, by the Council of the County of Dublin deciding to refuse to grant a permission for the erection of a refuse transfer station on a site at Greenview, Greenhills Road.

DECISION: Pursuant to the Local Government (Planning and Development) Acts, 1963 and 1976, permission is hereby refused for the erection of the said refuse transfer station for the reason set out in the Schedule hereto.

SCHEDULE

The proposed development would result in significant additional movements by heavy vehicles on the inadequate road system in the vicinity and such vehicle movements would endanger public safety by reason of traffic hazard and tend to create serious traffic congestion.

In pursuance of its functions under the above mentioned Acts the Dublin County Council, being the Planning Authority for the County Health District of Dublin, did by order, P/ **A/3324/79** dated **1st October, 1979.** decide to refuse: **XXXXXXXXXXXXXXXXXXXXX** PERMISSION **XXXXXXXXXXXXX** APPROVAL

For **Proposed refuse transfer station at Greenview, Greenhills Road.**

for the following reasons:

1. The proposed development which envisages a large number of heavy, commercial vehicles movements to and from the site onto the sub-standard Greenhills Road leading to the heavily trafficked Walkinstown Roundabout and to a adjoining inadequate road network, would endanger public safety by reason of a traffic hazard because of the unacceptable generation of heavy industrial vehicle movements onto the existing sub-standard road network. *bc*
2. The proposed development is premature pending the completion of construction of the Council's proposed major road network surface area and would not be in accordance with the proper planning and development of the area.

The appeal must be in writing and shall state the subject matter of the appeal and grounds of the appeal and should be addressed to An Bord Pleanala, Holbrook House, Holles Street, Dublin 2 and accompanied by a deposit of £10. When an appeal has been duly made and has not been withdrawn An Bord Pleanala will determine the application for permission as if it had been made to them in the first instance.
