AN BORD PLEANALA

APPEAL by Equipment Sales Limited, care of Peter Ferguson and Partners, 38, Wellington Road, Dublin, against the decision made on the 11th day of April, 1979, by the Council of the County of Dublin, deciding to refuse to grant a permission for the erection of the illuminated signs at Jobstown, Tallaght:

DECISION: Pursuant to the Local Government (Planning and Development) Acts, 1963 and 1976, permission is hereby refused for the erection of the said two illuminated signs for the reasons set out in the Schedule hereto.

SCHEDULE

1. The proposed signs by reason of their size and illumination are considered out of character with the existing character of this area and its zoning objectives, and would detract from the rural character of the area.
2. The proposed signs would endanger public safety by reason of traffic hazard because they would distract drivers on this heavily-trafficked national secondary route.
