AN BORD PLEANALA

APPEAL by Dublin Christian Mission, of 5 and 6 Chancery Place, Dublin and by Kenneth Hall, Primrose Hill, Lucan, County Dublin, against the decision made on the 18th day of April, 1979, by the Council of the County of Dublin, deciding to grant subject to conditions a permission for development comprising the erection of four houses, an entrance road and associated services at Primrose Hill, Lucan to J.A. Syme Limited of Clonrath, Chalet Gardens, Lucan, in accordance with plans and particulars lodged with the said Council:

DECISION: Pursuant to the Local Government (Planning and Development) Acts, 1963 and 1976, it is hereby decided, for the reasons set out in the First Schedule hereto, to grant permission for the said development in accordance with the said plans and particulars, subject to the conditions specified in column 1 of the Second Schedule hereto, the reasons for the imposition of the said conditions being as set out in column 2 of the said Second Schedule and the said permission is hereby granted subject to the said conditions.

FIRST SCHEDULE

Outline permission for this development was granted by the Minister for Local Government on 17th May, 1965 (Planning Control Number 4579). The principle of the development has accordingly been established and provided the conditions set out in the Second Schedule are complied with, the Board can see no objection on planning grounds to the details of the development the subject of the application for approval.

(b) Lodgement with the Council of cash the sum of £5,000 to be applied by the Council at its absolute discretion, if such services are not duly provided to its satisfaction, on the provision and completion of such services to standard specification or/..

(c) Lodgement with the Planning Authority of a letter of guarantee issued by anybody approved by the Planning Authority for the purpose in respect of the proposed development in accordance with the guarantee scheme agreed with the Planning Authority and such lodgement in any case has been acknowledged in writing by the Council.

Note: When development has been completed the Council may pursue the land to secure completion of the works required to bring the Estate up to the standard for taking-in-charge.
