An appeal shall be in writing and shall state the subject matter and grounds of the appeal. It should be addressed to.—An Bord Pieanala, Blocks 6 and 7, Irish Life Centre, Lower Abbey Street, Dublin 1.

(1) An appeal lodged by an applicant or his agent with An Bord Pleanala will be invalid unless accompanied by a fee of £30 (Thirty Pounds). (2) A party to an appeal making a request to An Bord Pleanala for an Oral Hearing of an appeal must, in addition to (1), pay to An Bord Pleanala a fee of £30 (Thirty Pounds). (3) A person who is not a party to an appeal must pay a fee of £10 Founds) to An Bord Pleanala when making submissions or observations to An Bord Pleanala in relation to an appeal.
