

## Reasons

The proposal would materially contravene Condition No. 8 of Permission No. S94A/0033 for a bungalow, septic tank and private garage on land to the east of the current application site. This condition states as follows:

"Prior to the commencement of development applicant shall submit a legally binding agreement under Section 38 of the Local Government (Planning and Development) Act 1963, restricting the lands outlined in blue on map submitted to the Planning Authority on 19/07/94. The agreement when approved by the planning authority shall be registered with the Land Registry".

The application site is within the lands subject to this sterilisation requirement.

**REASON:** 

In the interest of the proper planning and development of the area".

- The external facing and roofing materials and window design proposed in respect of the dormer bungalow do not accord with the Guidelines on the Design of Rural Dwellings contained in the South Dublin County Development Plan 1998.
- The visibility splays at the junction of Calliaghstown Lane and Johnstown Road (Rathcoole/Kilteel Road) are deficient and the generation of additional traffic/turning movements would endanger public safety by reason of a traffic hazard.
- The generation of additional traffic on this road network which is substandard in width, alignment, structure and drainage would endanger public safety by reason of a traffic hazard.
- This proposal constitutes undesirable ribbon development on a substandard rural road network, which will lead to a demand for the uneconomic provision of services and would set an undesirable precedent for further similar developments in the area.
