# QUIGLEY IN HURRY TO TAKE ON WORLD

**JASON Quigley doesn't want to waste any more time on his mission to conquer the world.**

Quigley won the NABO middleweight title in Las Vegas on Saturday and is primed to get a shot at a world title.

After defeating Shane Mosley Jr, Quigley called out the WBO world champion Demetrius "Boo Boo" Andrade.

If the chance comes to face the American, Quigley - who turned 30 last month - won't back down.

"Each fight now is going to be bigger than the last and that's the way I want it to go," he said.

"I am 30 years of age and, probably, this is the last chapter to my career and I just want to make it all worthwhile now."

"I want to give it absolutely everything I've got to grab every opportunity that comes my way with both hands and make every moment count."

"Since I started this game, I have wanted to be a World champion. If the opportunity came along and I got offered the Demetrius Andrade fight it would take a hell of a lot for me to turn that down."

**Unbeaten**  
"We have just got to see what comes along if that opportunity comes along, but I wouldn't be the person who says no to that fight without a doubt."

Last January, Andrade stopped Dubliner Luke Keeler in the ninth round and is unbeaten in 30 fights.

Quigley moved to 19-1 after a majority decision win at the weekend. The win is likely to move the Wick Valley puncher well into the top ten in the world rankings.

He said: "The Andrade fight is a very likely and a very easy fight to make because I have a version of the WBO belt now which is the legitimate one he has."

"He is an avoided fighter. He doesn't get a lot of people calling him out, a lot of the big guns don't really want to fight him because he is high risk with little reward."

"It is a good fight, get it made."

Another option for Quigley could be a showdown with Jaime Munguia, a fellow Golden Boy Promotions boxer.

He said: "It would be a very easy fight to make. That fight should be a world title eliminator - then possibly fight Andrade."

"There are a lot of options out there. It is great to have that because before this fight all the options weren't coming. It is like you are pushing for opportunities, you're pushing to get your foot in the door to get that breakthrough fight. It is great to be in this position."

**Unbeaten**  
Quigley went through the ropes at the weekend for the first time in 16 months.

A series of possible fights fell through the cracks, but Quigley returned with the best display of his professional career.

The former Irish amateur wants his latest win to act as a springboard.

He said: "I just want to stay busy, stay active. I want to keep fighting but I want every fight to be bigger than the last one."

"I don't want to be

taking any backward steps. I want to keep climbing the ladder. I want to keep making headlines as I push forwards towards that world title.

"Right now, I feel fresh as a daisy, fit as a fiddle. But it's always been in my head that I wouldn't like to be boxing past 35 years of age. So, I have five years now."

"I feel like this is the point, now, where I want to have big fights, good performances, world titles and really make a name for myself so I can leave the sport feeling fulfilled in what I've achieved in the game."

## MOTORSPORT Ireland have confirmed a calendar of events for the remainder of 2021.

It contains 68 "gated" events across six disciplines, including Mondello Park which resumes its car racing season with a double header on June 12/13.

That weekend remains a behind-closed-door or "gated" event, with no spectators allowed.

However, the governing body have provisionally included 17 "non-gated" events on the calendar, as the status of those are not yet permitted under public health restrictions.

Once non-gated events are given the green light, say Motorsport Ireland, meetings will take place between the organising clubs and the relevant sporting commissions to confirm their place on the 2021 calendar.

Thus the Munster Car Club's Moonraker Forestry Rally, provisionally scheduled for July 31, could well be the first rally in Ireland since the Mayo Stages in March 2020, while the Donegal International rally later this month hasn't been considered and won't run for a second successive year.

In fact, the Cork 20 on September 19 is the only international domestic

rally on the provisional calendar.

The first rally that would require a local council closed roads order would be the Ravens Rock Rally based in Carrick-on-Suir on August 8, while the Wexford Stages Rally is down for September 5.

Three clubs are planning short mini stages rallies in October and November before the return of the Rentokil Killarney Historic Rally on November 27.

**Process**

"It is hard to believe the last permitted Motorsport Ireland event took place in mid-September (2020)," said Motorsport Ireland president John Naylor.

It is heartening to see a return on the horizon and to have a calendar agreed is the first step in that process.

RORY McIlroy confirmed he will tee-up in today's starting Memorial, despite throwing a scare in the direction of the €7.6m event in Dublin, Ohio.

It also meant a cancellation of a proposed pre-tournament press conference, with the Hollywood star (above) citing 'personal reasons' for his absence.

However, McIlroy assured officials he will be taking his place in the opening round, starting at 6.44pm Irish time today.

**Debut**

McIlroy is competing in the Jack Nicklaus hosted event for a 10th occasion since making his debut in 2010, where he shared 10th place.

Joining McIlroy this week will be fellow Irish golfers and fellow Open Champions, Shane Lowry and Padraig Harrington.

Lowry is out first at 1.44pm (Irish) and Harrington at 2.06pm (Irish).
