I wish to address the proposed planning application No. SD21A/0155 for a mast 20 metres high located on the grounds of Church of the Holy Spirit, Ballyroan Parish Grounds, Rathfarnham, Dublin 14. The location proposed is right beside the playground area used by children enrolled in Pre School, Before and After School, Children's Art, Czech and Spanish Language classes which take place in Ballyroan Community and Youth Centre. 140 children use the playground each week pre Covid-19 pandemic. 80 of these children have been using it throughout the pandemic as childcare remained open to support front-line health care workers.

I manage Cáirde Before and After School Childcare and we have 60 children enrolled in the service. Our children play in the playground beside the proposed mast. Due to the pandemic, Cáirde staff have to adhere to increased Tusla health and wellbeing protocols including, operating play pods, daily temperature checks for children and staff, constant cleaning of surfaces, systematic hand washing and increased record keeping and administration. The current pandemic has put a sharp focus on health issues and the environment. The health and wellbeing of the children in my care and my staff is my primary objective.

I have researched without success to find a similar mast erected in a residential area next door to a children's playground in this country. While referencing the decision to remove a mast in Bishops Island, Watergrasshill Cork An Bord Pleanála said

"guidelines on the location of telecom antennae and support structures published by the Department of the Environment in 1996 made it a requirement that free standing masts should only be located in the immediate surrounds of villages "as a last resort".

I am aware that more independent studies are required to measure the impact radio waves have on children's growth and development. Without an independent health/environmental impact statement for this proposal for me to study in advance of the application to erect this mast, I request that the health and wellbeing of the children in my care and all the children and staff who use the playground be considered when looking at this application. For the issues highlighted above, I object to the proposed application.
