Dear SDCC Planning Department,

I wish to make an objection to the proposed 20 metre multi-user Telecommunications mast on Marian Road behind the Ballyroan Community and Youth Centre, on church grounds ref/no: SD21A/0155

My objections are as follows:

- 1. The proposed mast is much higher than the existing chimney that is there and would have an aesthetically displeasing appearance on the landscape. The shops at Rosemount Shopping Centre have flat roofs so the mast would be fully visible from the ground. It would be completely exposed.
- 2. Placing a large mast in a residential area is unusual and not in keeping with the elevation of surrounding structures.
- 3. While the mast will be close to the church and shopping centre, there are residential properties directly across the road facing the proposed site area, categorising this stretch of Rathfarnham as suburban and unsuited as a location for a large telecommunications mast which would more properly be located in an industrial area. Marian Road is certainly not that.
- 4. To quote designer William Morris, "Have nothing in your houses that you do not know to be useful or believe to be beautiful." I believe that the same applies to outdoor spaces, and while masts may have their uses in the right location, they certainly are not beautiful, and I urge you most emphatically not to allow this planning application to go ahead.
- 5. Residents on Marian Road and the adjoining streets are known for their 'tidy-town' spirit: they maintain their gardens and verges beautifully with hanging baskets, ornaments and flowerpots. Placing a 20 meter mask in this location would be entirely incongruous and an insult to the hard work undertaken by its residents over the years.
- 6. Placing a 20 metre mast on Marian Road, beside a church, library, and in close proximity to a community centre and creche, would be a mistake. This location is at the centre of our community where people visit their doctor, meet for coffee, collect their old age pension, take dancing lessons, get married and attend church. It is no place for a 20 meter telecommunications mast!

I believe that a decision in favour of this application would be something that we would all come to regret in time. I urge you to reject this planning application.
