**TENNIS FEDERER TURNS ON THE STYLE**

**ROGER Federer found his form on the lawns of SW19 to comfortably defeat Richard Gasquet and set up a third-round clash with Cameron Norrie.**

This was a throwback match, with the pair having first met at Wimbledon 15 years ago, and although it was not quite vintage Federer yesterday, it was certainly a great improvement on his performance against Adrian Panatta in round one. The eight-time champion had been two sets to one down when his French opponent slipped and suffered a knee injury that forced him to retire.

**Fall**

The knowledge that he had beaten Gasquet in 18 of their 20 previous meetings, including the last 11, no doubt gave him a little extra confidence and, after coming through a close first set, Federer pulled away to win 7-6 (1) 6-1 6-4. The 39-year-old had at least been fighting back when Panatta had his unfortunate fall. He was shaky again at the start here, saving three break points in his opening service game. But Federer began to show more conviction in his shots as the set wore on and played a fine

tie-break, ending a run of four straight tie-breaks lost at Wimbledon taking in one against Mannarino and three in the 2019 final versus Novak Djokovic.

**Knee**

The Swiss relies on impeccable footwork and timing for his aggressive game, and it is no surprise that has not come back immediately following his lengthy absence, in which he had two knee operations.

The second set saw Federer in total control, and a break of his old rival's serve in the seventh game of the third set paved the way for a dominant victory.

Gasquet tried to challenge an ace on match point only to be told he had used all his up, which rather summed up his evening.

Meanwhile, second seed Daniil Medvedev subdued some early fight from Spain's Carlos Alcaraz before brutally dispatching the talented teenager 6-4 6-1 6-2 yesterday to reach the third round.

Medvedev, who has never gone past the third round at the All England Club, said: "Every tournament I play since I'm a junior, I try to win."

**Capable**

"Sometimes you know maybe when you are, I don't know, top 60 in the world, you're just coming up, you feel like maybe I'm not going to win a Grand Slam this week," he said.

"I was in two finals. We all know we are capable of going far."

"I think that's the mindset of everybody."

**Gauff front and Centre once more**

**COCO Gauff** was back at the scene where her life exploded but admits she cannot remember much about her Centre Court achievements of 2019.

The American became the story of Wimbledon by making it from qualifying to the fourth round as a 15-year-old.

Her Centre Court debut came in the third-round victory against Polona Herczeg, producing some of the most memorable scenes in the tournament's history as she saved match points to earn a famous win.

Her journey ended against eventual champion Simona Halep in the next round, but she became the sweet heart of the main show court.

And on her first return there she showed how far she has come, easing past former world number 13 Elena Vesnina 6-4 6-3 in 70 minutes to book her third-round spot.

**Nervous**

Gauff, now 17, admits she was more nervous stepping on to the main show court this time, primarily because she has little recollection of two years ago.

"It did feel a lot different. I honestly was more nervous coming into today's match," she said.

"I think the biggest thing is I don't really remember much from my Centre Court experience in 2019."

"I don't know, I felt like it was all a blur."

"But going in today I feel like a completely different player and person."

"It wasn't my best tennis today, but I think mentally I gave a good performance considering how nervous I was."

**CAVENDISH JUST TOUR-RIFIC!**

**MARK Cavendish** secured his second win of this year's Tour de France and the 32nd of his storied career with victory on stage six into Chateauroux.

Two days after taking his first Tour stage success in five years, Cavendish doubled up as he comfortably won ahead of Jasper Philipsen and Nacer Bouhanni.

**PARKER**

It completed a hat-trick of victories for Cavendish in Chateauroux and also brought up 50 Grand Tour stage wins in total.

Cavendish showed pace and his experience in the finale of the 160.6km stage from Tours, coming off the wheel of his Deceuninck-QuickStep lead-out man

Michael Morkov to instead latch on to Philipsen's Alpecin-Fenix train before coming around the Belgian.

**Wheels**

"Wow," Cavendish said. "It's 10 years since my last win here. It's pretty special..."

"Michael left me space on the left to go but I wanted just a split second longer in

the wheels so I had to switch trains."

"But you see the guys, how much they pull. You've got the world champion Julian Alaphilippe just burying himself in the last kilometres. It's something special. I'm buzzing now."

Cavendish was a late call-up to the Tour this year following an injury to Sam Bennett.
