Ellen, Róisín end on a high

IRELAND'S swimming Paralympians made another big splash as they completed their events in Tokyo.

Ellen Keane and Róisín Ní Riain both finished with personal bests after a memorable Games. Keane, with a gold medal already in her bag, was in fourth place at halfway in the final of the SM9 Women's 200m Individual Medley. She put in a brilliant 50m breaststroke to enter the final 50m with hopes of a medal. It was not to be but the Dubliner still powered home fifth in 2:38.64. Keane said: "I hadn't really reflected that much on the gold, I was just trying to get focused and not get too caught up in it but now I can feel the emotions creeping in." Ireland's busiest Paralympian also brought her campaign to a close and it was one that will live long in the young Limerick woman's memory. Ní Riain maintained her record of reaching finals at her first Games and set a new personal best in the SB13 100m Breaststroke as she touched the wall seventh. She can now reflect on an excellent first Para-

lympics where she swam in five finals, setting personal bests in four.

She said: "I'm very pleased with that race, it was faster than this morning, another PB and I'm very happy. 'I've loved every minute of it and tried to take it all in, it's been a pretty amazing experience.'"

Despite saving her best throw until last, Cork discus thrower Niamh McCarthy finished fifth in the F41 final.

The Rio silver medalist and three time world medalist produced her best throw of 28.94m in the sixth round.

Her first-round 28.59m saw her lying third after the second round but the standard of competition was sensational.

McCarthy said: "I'm happy with my performance. It's been a very hard few years so just to make it here and to have a few good throws... I'm happy with that."

Gary O'Reilly had another good ride and was in contention as the H5 Road Race unfolded.

The Laois man stayed with the group until near the end and finished fourth in 2:24.57.
