**EMMA RADUCANU has not seen the US Open trophy since returning home - and now she has given it AWAY.**

After leaving New York following her victory, the 18-year-old handed back the real thing to officials and was given a replica.

Yet she did not bring that through Heathrow Airport's customs, deciding instead to let the LTA display it at their London HQ.

Raducanu said: "It's not at home, it's going to be stored at the National Tennis Centre in London if you want to see it. I just thought the LTA have done so much for me."

After a battling fightback in the first round of the Transylvania Open, Raducanu played much better in her 6-3 6-4 second-round win over Romanian No106 Ana Bogdan.

She faces Ukrainian No6 seed Marta Kostyuk today.

## Whyte: Fury may duck me

**DILLIAN WHYTE reckons Tyson Fury could swerve their long-awaited Battle of Britain by hanging up his gloves.**

The WBC are set to order the Gypsy King to defend his heavyweight title against his former sparring partner and interim title holder next year.

But Whyte, 33, refuses to get his hopes up.

Whyte said: "The Tyson Fury fight is one I wanted, it's a fight I tried to get before. It was mandatory and it didn't happen. Fortunately for me now, it seems like it's going to go ahead."

"But you can never bank on anything Fury says. He might say, 'You know what? I've had enough. I don't want to fight anymore.'"

"Or he might say, 'I need a longer rest'. He's had three hard fights with Deontay Wilder. So we'll just have to wait and see."

Whyte (right) wants a blockbuster stadium clash with Fury, who is eyeing a spectacular homecoming in March.

He said: "It's a major fight if we can dust-up in the early part of next year in a stadium. We've

spared each other, had our ups and downs and beefs.

"But, logically, he'll think, 'It's a good homecoming fight and it should happen.'"

Whyte was due to face Swede Otto Wallin in a title eliminator at London's O2 tomorrow night but was forced to pull out with a shoulder injury.

He said: "People say, 'You pulled out because of Fury'. If that was true, I'd have pulled out weeks ago when I knew the mandatory position was in place and saved a lot of money on my training camp."
