**Drogheda Utd.. 0
Dundalk.....1**

DUNDALK can see Cleary now the pain has gone – as a big win in the Wee County derby restored local bragging rights.

Dan Cleary's goal three minutes from time earned the Lilywhites a vital victory over Drogheda United to ease their fears of being forced into the relegation play-off.

They are now six points clear of Finn Harps with a far healthier goal difference and there was the added bonus of going ahead of their Louth rivals.

The Drogs have not finished ahead of Dundalk since 2012 but it looked on for much of this season as the Lilywhites have floundered, but now it is Drogheda looking a little uneasily at Finn Harps five points behind them.

It was all sealed by one moment in a tight game and Cleary's goal.

Dundalk boss Vinny Perth spent the 30 seconds beforehand roaring at Darragh Leahy to get Will Patching to take a free-kick. When he did, he lifted it into a dangerous area where Cleary rose to glance home the only goal of the game.

Before that, there was little between the sides with the best action off the pitch.

There was plenty of pyro, songs and banners as the 1,861-strong crowd made noise.

But those on the pitch played as if the consequences of defeat were on their minds with both sides starting with outside chances of Europe as well as ending in the relegation play-off place.

Dundalk's Sean Murray headed at David Odumou early on and later saw

him save an ambitious shot from halfway. Both sides had goals ruled out for infringements. Daniel O'Reilly's Drogs header was chalked off as Ronan Murray's corner had gone out of play, while Andy Boyle nudged Dane Massey in the back when he headed home for Dundalk.

After the break, Drogs were lucky not to fall behind when Odumou fumbled Patching's long-range shot up on to his own bar. It could have gone anywhere but bounced back down and the keeper gathered at the second attempt. Murray, Patching and

Patrick Hoban all had half-chances for Dundalk before the hosts' Gary Deegan blazed a free off target.

But with the game seemingly heading for a scoreless draw, Cleary struck.
