APPLICANT Sisters of Charity.

In pursuance of its functions under the above mentioned Act the Dublin County Council, being the Planning Authority for the County Health District of Dublin, did by order TP/742/65 Dated 4.6.65 make a decision pursuant to Section 26 (1) of the Act to grant a permission for Temporary School for Girls near Mountdown Park, Greenhills.

subject to the following conditions:-

- (1) That adequate and suitable fire precautions be undertaken to the satisfaction of the County Engineer.
- (2) That structural details of the proposed buildings, as well as the necessary sanitary services be provided to the satisfaction of the County Engineer.
- (3) That adequate and suitable toilet accommodation be undertaken as required by the Chief Medical Officer.
- (4) That the structures be allowed to stand only until the 30th June, 1967, or until the proposed permanent school is erected, whichever time is the sooner.
- (5) That the applicant enter into an undertaking to observe the foregoing conditions.

If there is no appeal to the Minister for Local Government against this decision, permission will be granted by the Council on the expiration of the period for the taking of such appeal. If every appeal made in accordance with the Act has been withdrawn, the Council will grant the permission as soon as may be after the withdrawal.
