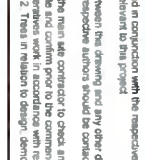

When contradictions between the drawings and any other design information are identified, the drawings shall prevail over the design information.

It is the responsibility of the main site contractor to check and verify all information on drawings against the response arboricultural report to ensure that all site operations are in accordance with the response arboricultural report and BSS637:2012. Trees in relation to design, demolition and construction are shown in red.

**BSS637 2012 Tree Categorisation**

- Category A**  
Trees of high quality with an estimated remaining life expectancy of at least 40 years
- Category B**  
Trees of moderate quality with an estimated life expectancy of at least 20 years
- Category C**  
Trees of low quality with an estimated life expectancy of at least 10 years, or young trees with a stem diameter below 150mm
- Category U**  
Trees in a condition that they cannot realistically be retained as living trees in the context of the current land use for longer than 10 years

**KEY**

- Road Protection Areas
- The minimum area around a tree deemed to contain the root collar / rooting volume to maintain the trees viability
- Tree, Shrub or Hedgehog Group

**T520**

- Tree Protection Zone - Protective fencing to be installed as per Specification Designated Construction Exclusion Zone
- Area of existing hard standing to be retained
- Excavation works to construct driveway to be carried out under arboricultural supervision
- Exposed roots to be cleanly pruned using a sharp stem secateurs
- Special engineered foundations required for the construction of the proposed carport / home shed out under arboricultural supervision
- Shed 1 to be demolished with a lightweight machine using the 'top down, pull back' method of works
- Existing graveyard wall to be retained and act as appropriate tree protection
- Proposed four (4) run within RPPAs of trees to be installed under arboricultural supervision and large clumps of fibrous roots retained and protected
- Site boundary
