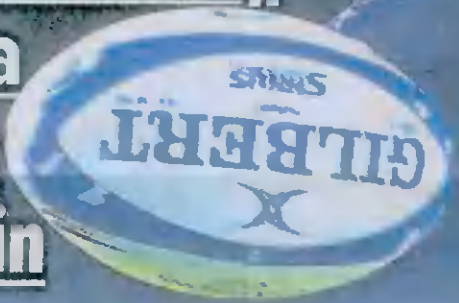

OUT OF LARMOUR'S WAY

Stu: Jordan ready to make a big splash once again

STUART LANCASTER believes Jordan Larmour will go again as he hits the second phase of his career.

Larmour, 24, put the disappointment of his November Ireland inaction behind him last Friday with a try-scoring performance in Leinster's URC win over Connacht.

He is now likely to keep his place as the province get this season's Champions Cup underway when Bath visit the Aviva Stadium on Saturday.

Lancaster acknowledged the crowd turning up may not be as excited as they once were to see Larmour, who did not make Andy Farrell's 23 for any of last month's three games.

There have been injuries since he burst on to the scene with a solo try against Munster at Christmas 2017, before another magic moment against Italy in Chicago the following year.

But Lancaster believes it is part of every player's career trajectory – as the early excitement is replaced by familiarity – and he backed him to bring the buzz back.

Lancaster said: "Jordan is always very confident, and rightly so because he's got unbelievable ability. "What often happens with young players when they come into the scenario, and this happens many times, is that they go on this steep curve from nothing to almost international rugby.

"Then obviously they get more and more attention, they get more scrutiny, people are beginning to talk about them in high praise and high terms.

"Often there's either a dip or a plateau, and then obviously it's the great players who come again.

"I think Jordan was probably frustrated not getting more opportunities in November with Ireland and he's a form player who I think gets better by playing and by training.

"While I know he was disappointed with a couple of things at the weekend against Connacht, I'm seeing a lot of improvement in him and he's certainly very diligent in terms of

working on his game. So I'm certainly not concerned, he's a great player, but I just think it's part of the learning curve for a young player.

"I think it happens to all of them. You could say the same about some of the other young players like a James Ryan or Garry Ringrose. I've seen it with so many players.

"You get more scrutiny, you get selected, and then suddenly it becomes a bit harder because people are targeting you and analysing you more.

"So he's going through that process now but I think from what I'm seeing in training, he's come out the other side and he's still very much a big part of our plans here for sure."

Lancaster admitted that getting the most out of Larmour is a crucial factor if Leinster are to climb back to the top of European rugby.

They have been undone in the last three seasons by powerful packs, as La Rochelle and Saracens, twice, have ended their trophy hopes.

But, while Lancaster believes Leinster's pack – predominantly the Ireland pack – is stronger than ever, he insisted other areas are as important.

He said: "With all due respect to some of the international teams in November, you play against a La Rochelle or a Toulouse or a Saracens or a Leicester now, you've not just got teams who are stacked with homegrown international talent, they are supplemented by overseas international talent as well.

"For Leinster to win at the highest level, it's not just trying to beat the power teams at their own game, it's getting every bit of your own game right. You have to get everything right at the highest level, in international rugby or top-end European rugby, to win the game."

Leinster are likely to be without Johnny Sexton, James Ryan, Jack Conan and Cian Healy, though Lancaster is confident they will all be OK for next week's trip to Montpellier.
