WHEREAS the charitable trusts the subject of this Cy-Près application (the "Charitable Trusts") were established in the following manner:

1. Healy Trust: By his Will dated 4th September 1865 (with one codicil was annexed dated 30th October 1866), Daniel Healy gave devised and bequeathed the Leasehold Interest in a premises known as the "Kilcock Premises" unto his executors upon trust for his wife, Mary Healy for life and thereafter upon trust for the Roman Catholic Bishop for the time being exercising episcopal authority in the Diocese of Kildare & Leighlin and (2) the Roman Catholic Priest for the time being of the Parish of Kilcock for the purpose of establishing and maintaining schools for the poor of the Parish of Kilcock to be carried and under the superintendence of the Christian Brothers; and

2. Geoghegan Trust: By a Deed dated the 17th May 1875 (the "Deed") made between (1) the Reverend Thomas Geoghegan (Parish Priest of Kilcock) (the "Grantor") and (2) the Right Reverend James Walshe (Roman Catholic Bishop of Kildare & Leighlin), the said Reverend Thomas Geoghegan and James Aloysius Hoare (Superior General of the Christian Brothers) (the "Grantees"), the Grantor conveyed the freehold interest in the Kilcock Premises to the Grantees, to hold the same upon the trust according to the terms set out in the Deed, which includes the upkeep of buildings used as and for schools for the education of Roman Catholic students under the superintendence of the Christian Brothers.

The Bishop of Kildare and Leighlin and the Congregation of Christian Brothers (the "Congregation") (together the "Trustees") are the trustees of the Charitable Trusts. The Trustees have sold the Kilcock Premises (being the property comprised in the Charitable Trusts) and now make a Cy Près application for the distribution of the proceeds of the sale.

AND WHEREAS the Congregation no longer operates any schools in Kilcock. Therefore the specific purpose of the Charitable Trusts cannot be fulfilled by the Congregation who now seek to apply the net proceeds of sale to two schools in the Parish of Kilcock which were formerly under the superintendence of the Christian Brothers, namely Scoil Dara secondary School (RCN20201769) and St Joseph's Boys National School Kilcock (RCN20124410).

AND WHEREAS the Congregation has requested the Authority to frame a Scheme for the application Cy-Près of the net proceeds of sale of the Kilcock Premises to
