## **Description of Site and Surroundings:**

Site Area: as stated 0.0217 Hectares as stated on application.

### **Site Description:**

The site is located mid road along Orwell Park Rise and contains a two-storey, semi-detached house with hipped roof profile. The dwellings along this road are built on a consistent even building line with pitched concrete roof tile canopy over most entrances facades projecting from the front of the street dwellings. It is noted that front porch extensions are highly evident with the pattern of development in the area.

#### **Assessment**

### **Zoning and Council Policy**

The development comprising a front extension is consistent in principle with zoning objective 'RES' – 'To protect and/or improve residential amenity', subject to the relevant provisions in the County Development Plan 2016-2022 and the House Extension Design Guide.

#### Residential & Visual Amenity

### Front Extension

The extension for retention does not protrude forward beyond 1.5m of the principle front façade. The extension is considered consistent with the guidance set out in Section 4 'Front Extensions' of the South Dublin County Council House Extension Design Guide (2010) and is acceptable and would be broadly consistent with the zoning objective which seeks to 'To protect and/or improve Residential Amenity' under the South Dublin County Council Development Plan 2016-2022.

### **Services & Drainage**

Regarding surface water drainage and flood risk, no report was requested however it is considered that standard recommendations can be addressed by way of condition of permission.

### Screening for Appropriate Assessment

Having regard to the scale and nature of the development, connection to public services and the distance from Natura sites, it is considered that the development would not be likely to have a significant effect individually or in combination with other plans or projects on a European site.

### Environmental Impact Assessment

Having regard to the modest nature of the development, and the distance of the site from nearby sensitive receptors, there is no real likelihood of significant effects on the environment arising from the proposed development. The need for environmental impact assessment can, therefore, be excluded at preliminary examination and a screening determination is not required.

#### SECOND SCHEDULE

#### **Conditions and Reasons**

1. Development to be in accordance with submitted plans and details.

The development shall be retained and completed fully in accordance with plans, particulars and specifications lodged with the application, save as may be required by other conditions attached hereto.

REASON: To ensure that the development is in accordance with the permission and that effective control is maintained.

#### 2. Surface Water.

- (a) All works shall comply with the Building Regulations -Technical guidance document-Part H Drainage and Wastewater disposal.
- (b) There shall be complete separation of the foul and surface water drainage throughout the site.
- (c) All requirements of the Greater Dublin Regional Code of Practice for Drainage Works shall be complied with.

REASON: In the interests of public health, the proper planning and sustainable development of the area and in order to ensure adequate water supply and drainage provision.

#### 3. Financial Contributions.

The developer shall pay to the Planning Authority a financial contribution of €376.16 (three hundred and seventy six euros and sixteen cents), in respect of public infrastructure and facilities benefiting development within the area of the Planning Authority, that is provided, or intended to be provided by or on behalf of the authority, in accordance with the terms of the Development Contribution Scheme 2021 - 2025, made under Section 48 of the Planning and Development Act 2000 (as amended). This contribution is to be paid on receipt of Final Grant of Permission.

REASON: The provision of such facilities will facilitate the proposed development. It is considered reasonable that the payment of a contribution be required, in respect of public infrastructure and facilities benefiting development in the area of the Planning Authority and that is provided, or that is intended will be provided, by or on behalf of the Local Authority.
