



LOWRY... five over

Shane 'n Wee-Mac let it slip

SHANE LOWRY and Rory McIlroy fell away as Thomas Pieters delivered a composed final round to claim victory in the Abu Dhabi Championship.

Lowry had ended the third round one shot behind Scott Jamieson, who led after each of the first three days.

The Offaly man matched the Scot on the final day but it was not a good one for either as both carded five-over-par 77s.

Lowry's round started with a triple-bogey seven on the opening hole and he could never regain momentum from there and finished the weekend on five under, five shots behind winner Pieters.

Alongside him was McIlroy, who earlier moved to within two of the lead, courtesy of a superb 141-yard eagle on the par-four ninth and a birdie on 13.

But his round fell apart with three bogeys in the final five holes.

The Holywood ace remained upbeat, however, saying: "Honestly, I am just happy that I got to play an extra two days."

"I had to make a birdie on the last hole on Friday night just to be here, and I almost made the most of the weekend."

"Then a couple of loose shots coming in cost me."

"It wasn't the finish I wanted but it was good to play another 36 holes."

Belgian Pieters, who turns 30 on Thursday, finished one shot clear of Spaniard Rafa Cabrera Bello and 450-1 outsider Shubhankar Sharma to take his sixth DP World Tour triumph.

He beamed: "I just hope all the juniors back in Belgium are watching this."

"When Nico Colsaerts came on the scene and started winning that was inspiring and I hope that is the same for the kids back home today."

CHAMPIONS CUP

SIMON ZEBO had a record-smashing day as Munster ended Wasps' European campaign.

The Corkman scored his 24th and 25th Champions Cup tries for Munster, overtaking the late Anthony Foley as the province's top try scorer in the competition.

And in doing so, he also became the top Irish try-scorer in the European Championship, as the nine he scored during his time with Racing 92 puts him on 34 overall, one ahead of Brian O'Driscoll.

Zebo's first try, coupled with efforts from Conor Murray and Jack O'Donoghue, had the Thomond Park hosts 24-7 ahead at half-time.

Last week's conquering of Toulouse meant injury-hit Wasps still had a shot at reaching the round of 16, while Munster were already through and eyeing up a higher seeding.

Dan Robson touched down for the visitors in the 27th minute, but Jeremy Loughman, Zebo and Rory Scannell made it six tries in the end for Munster, who finished third in Pool B. Munster head coach

Johann van Graan said: "We wanted to make sure we won the game and if the four tries were on offer, we wanted to take them."

"Obviously, Leicester got five points and Harlequins won that game in the 83rd minute so the only thing that we could control was getting the five points, but real positives out of tonight's game."

Munster had some late reshuffling before kick-off, with Loughman and Zebo starting in place of the ill Dave Kilcoyne and Keith Earls, who suffered a leg strain in training that Van Graan said should not keep him out of the Six Nations.

With the lifting of Covid-19 restrictions in Ireland, the larger-than-expected 13,047-strong crowd were treated to a strong start from the hosts.

A TMO review ruled out a potential knock-on prior to Murray's ninth-minute opener, the scrum-half pouncing on the loose ball to score after a terrific initial carry from Gavin Coombes. Ben Healy con-

verted, tagged on a penalty and then provided a clever chip-kick assist for Zebo to bundle over from close range.

Healy's conversion made it 17-0, but Robson marked his return from a groin injury with a sharply-finished try. He reached over after a quick-tap penalty.

The extras were added by Charlie Atkinson, who was then swatted away by Coombes in the build-up to O'Donoghue's try on the half-hour mark. Healy's boot restored the 17-point gap.

Munster ended the first half with 14 men, No8 Coombes seeing yellow for a series of infringements.

Yet Wasps were unable to convert the pressure into points.

The sight of Thomas Young being carried off on a stretcher for a head injury was another blow for an already-weakened Wasps, who conceded again five minutes after the restart.

Prop Loughman drove over after a maul had done the damage.

All Crossdale intercepted to prevent another Munster score.

And despite Robson being binned for an early challenge on Murray, the visitors held firm despite some loose kicking from Atkinson and

Will Porter. A trademark Tadhg Beirne turnover ruined a promising Josh Bassett-led attack, before Munster produced a late flourish, profiting from fly-half Atkinson's sin-binning in the 77th minute.

A sweeping attack ended with Zebo crossing in the left corner, and a fine break by the 31-year-old set up Scannell to stroll over at the death.

Replacement Jack Crowley kicked both conversions.

Van Graan had high praise for 22-year-old fly-half Healy following his assured performance.

He finished with 11 points kicked from the boot and provided a deft assist for Zebo's first try.

South African Van Graan said: "We knew that Wasps were still in the Champions Cup if they won the game, so we treated it as a knock-out game."

"There was no specific message to Ben, just go out and enjoy it and steer the ship."

"I felt he had a really good game, the first assist for Zeebs, that little chip for Zeebs, his decision-making, pretty good defensively."

CARTY LAMENTS LATE LOSS

CONNACHT out-half Jack Carty admits they have to learn to close out games if they are to upset Leinster in the Champions Cup round of 16.

Andy Friend's side slipped to a late defeat in Paris against 14-man Stade Francais in the final round of pool fixtures yesterday.

Connacht had already qualified for the knockout stages for the first time but missed out on a chance to get a more favourable draw.

They now face their provincial rivals in a two-legged play-off in April and Carty admitted: "We are bitterly

disappointed. It was quite similar to how we finished the game last week when we lost to Leicester.

"We were 11 points up today, and 14 points up last week. We do so well to put ourselves in these positions, but against teams like Stade Francais you can't switch off. "Unfortunately, we did, and we were punished for it."

"We got a yellow card to Conor Oliver towards the end which evened things up."

"For the most of the game, we played quite well, but

some forced turnovers and offloads cost us. The three games we lost we should have probably won. We don't want to be a nearly team."

"These sort of games where you are ahead by a couple of points you need to close them out. I'm as guilty as anyone."

Connacht led for most of the match but tries from Adrian Lapegue (two), Ngani Laumape, Kylan Hamdaoui, and Ryan Chapuis, along with 12 points from Joris Segonds and Nicholas Sanchez, got Stade over the line.

Connacht got two bonus points with Alex Wootton, Caoilin Blade, Tom Farrell and Jarrad Butler crossing for tries, while Carty kicked 11 points.

The visitors looked almost

certain to emerge victorious when Stade hooker Tolu Latu was sent off after his second yellow card for a no-arms clearout, and then swearing at referee Wayne Barnes.

But the Parisians refused to throw in the towel, and a last-gasp penalty from Segonds earned them victory.

Stade wing Telusa Veainu said: "We really had to dig deep. I think the red card made us gel together better."

"Sometimes when things like that happen it brings us closer together because it makes us work harder."

ALL RIGHT FOR WILLIE

ALLAHO is 5-4 from 7-4 to retain his Ryanair Chase crown after completing back-to-back wins in the Grade 2 Horse & Jockey Hotel Chase at Thurles. With shades of Ascot and Energumene, Townend again bossed the race from the front on Allaho. Only this time for Townend there was no Shishkin to see off and the John Durkan hero stayed on well to beat Fakir D'Ouderies by 12 lengths - the same as he did in last year's race at the Festival. It was a sixth win in 15 races for the Willie Mullins-trained Allaho (right). Mullins said: "It took him a while to warm up. For him I thought he was sticky over the first few fences.
