Lancaster happy he passed challenge

STUART LANCASTER believes familiarity with each other helped Leinster contemptuously swat aside Montpellier and Bath.

And the Englishman believes the province's combinations can help Ireland to a successful Six Nations. After five weeks of inaction - which included a controversial walkover defeat to Montpellier - they have come back with a bang with 23 tries in two matches against the French outfit and Bath. That has teed up a last-16 Champions Cup meeting with Connacht in April. Coach Lancaster said: "Cancelled games and five weeks of having to train against each other was frustrating as much, to be honest. "It was certainly a big coaching challenge because you've got 35 to 40 of your best players and in order to generate match intensity you have to play them against each other. You imagine

pitching Will Connors against Josh van der Flier or Johnny Sexton against Ross Byrne or Jamison Gibson-Park against Luke McGrath, the whole competitiveness of training went up during that period. "Normally as a coach you would train hard, they would hear my voice and the other coaches' voices Monday, Tuesday, tailing off towards the players driving it towards the game. "But obviously the Thursday, Friday became the game and I think we had enough of training against each other, to be honest. "The win at The Rec was the last time for more than two months that Leo Cullen and Lancaster will have all of their frontline stars together as they head off on international duty. Lancaster had an

upbeat assessment on whether Jordan Larmour, van der Flier, James Ryan and Tadhg Furlong would be fit to face Wales in the Six Nations opener on February 5. He said: "They fly to Portugal and with a good week's training out there I'd be surprised if they're not in contention. "As a former England coach, Lancaster (right) knows all about trying to pull players from different sides together but reckons his former assistant Andy Farrell is in a good place with Ireland. He said: "With England, usually there was three or four from most of the top-end clubs, certainly the top eight. "When I first took over, the sort of top teams were Saracens, Bath, Northampton and Leicester but all four of them played differently, very differently and they all clearly believed in the way that they

are playing because they had achieved success. "In Ireland having only four teams which are all different in their own way but a lot of the emphasis is similar, which I think for Andy it's a real strength. "With 16 Leinster players in the panel that should also provide some continuity. Lancaster said: "There's a company called Gainline Analytics and it looks at team cohesion and basically their premise is the team that has the most experience of playing together generally comes out on top when all things are equal. "It's not necessarily club combinations. "Conor Murray and Johnny Sexton, even though they don't play at the same club, they know each other inside-out. "I think Ireland are in a good place."

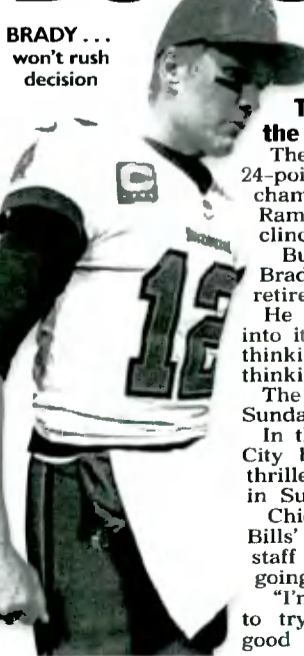
RORY: THERE'S NO MAJOR CONCERN

RORY McILROY says he still has what it takes to win another Major. The Holywood ace, 32, has drawn a blank since landing the last of his four Majors in 2014. But the world No 8 - who only needs The Masters to complete the Grand Slam - believes patience is key to bagging one of golf's big events. McIlroy, who tees up in the Dubai Desert Classic on Thursday, said: "I've played good enough golf in those seven years to win a Major and I'm staying as patient as I possibly can. "I don't think there's anything I should or could do differently. "The one thing that's held me back, especially in the Majors over the last few years, is just getting off to slow starts. "I can't go into the first round under pressure to shoot a good score. I just have to let it happen."

TOM BRADY will not rush a decision on his future after Tampa Bay were dumped out of the NFL play-offs. The superstar quarterback led a 24-point fightback for the defending champions before the Los Angeles Rams kicked a last-gasp field goal to clinch a 27-30 victory. But seven-time Super Bowl winner Brady, 44, refused to comment about retirement. He said: "I haven't put a lot of thought into it. We'll just take it day by day. I'm thinking about this game, I'm not even thinking past five minutes from now." The Rams now host San Francisco in Sunday's NFC Championship game. In the AFC divisional play-offs, Kansas City beat Buffalo 42-36 in an overtime thriller and host Cincinnati for a place in Super Bowl LVI. Chiefs QB Patrick Mahomes hailed the Bills' fight, saying: "With that coaching staff and the players they have, there's going to be a lot of battles. "I'm glad we got this one. We're going to try to keep it rolling. We've got a good team coming in next week."
