CHRIS EUBANK JNR grew up with a boxing icon as his father, so he wasn't starstruck to have ring legend Roy Jones Jnr as his lodger.

Legend Jones keeps Eubank full of beans

There has been no squabbling between the two housemates but the Brighton boxer has noticed the coffee beans have been disappearing as fast as some of Jones Jnr's opponents once did. "He's great, he doesn't make any noise, goes to bed early, chills, he makes his coffees," said Eubank Jnr. "He loves his coffee and he's stolen all my coffee beans in the house, but he's a very good guy to be around."

The Motorpoint Arena can rattle his rival. The Welshman has certainly got under Eubank Jnr's skin with his social media outbursts. Eubank Jnr is perplexed as to why he is still seen as the bad guy in the promotion for the middleweight fight. "It blows my mind that I'm still seen as the bad guy," he said. "That's always how I'm portrayed. I never go out there and disrespect guys, talk about their families. That's something I've never done."

but it would be no shock if he didn't. It was pointed out to Eubank Jnr that, at 32, his father had already retired having had a glittering career, while he is still searching for his peak, with his only defeats in 33 fights to Billy Joe Saunders and George Groves. "This year we want to win world titles at middleweight," he added.

Eubank Jnr (32) teamed up with four-weight world champion Jones Jnr during the first Covid lockdown and the American jetted into the UK to prepare him for his clash with middleweight rival Liam Williams this weekend in Cardiff.

"Yeah I've got my banter, my chat, but I never cross the line. We are supposed to be professional, we have kids looking up to us."

Jones Jnr, who reigned as middleweight, super-middleweight, light-heavyweight and heavyweight champion, has been living with his fighter in Brighton ahead of the fight. "It's awesome to have him living with me," said Eubank Jnr, whose father Chris Snr was a two-weight world champion. "It's a privilege to have Roy here and have him believe in me so much. It adds that extra motivation." "When you have a legend like Roy who you've watched throughout your whole life and he's with you and he really believes in you, it makes you fight harder." This is set to be a hard fight tonight in the Welsh capital. Williams (29) will be hopping a hostile atmosphere at

Getting the win is crucial for Eubank Jnr. Williams is a very good middleweight but came up short in his world-title shot against Demetrius Andrade last year. If the Brighton man has any hopes of emulating his father in becoming a world champion he must see off Williams.
