

England loss no laughing matter



LUKE COWAN-DICKIE hit back at accusations he was smiling after his yellow card against Scotland.

The England hooker apologised for his sin-binning, which also saw ref Ben O'Keefe award a penalty try.

Cowan-Dickie deliberately batted the ball into touch, preventing Scotland wing Darcy Graham from getting on the end of a 66th-minute Finn Russell cross-kick.

England's 17-10 lead was wiped out and Russell then kicked a game-winning penalty with Cowan-Dickie (left) on the sidelines.

Cowan-Dickie reacted to a fan's tweet which accused him of walking off the pitch laughing.

He replied: "Laughing at the ball boy giving me abuse. Didn't want to say anything as my head was gone. Wasn't laughing at what I did."

Cowan-Dickie said sorry on social media after Saturday's loss.

The Exeter star tweeted: "Just want to apologise to all you supporters. I let myself and you guys down. Every time I play for my country I want nothing more than to make you guys proud."

But Eddie Jones has told his "gutted" England troops to "get back in the fire"

after their 20-17 Calcutta Cup calamity. The head coach said: "When you have got dominance like we had, in terms of territory and possession, and penalty count, you've got to make it count for more."

Scrum-half Ben Youngs revealed: "Tom spoke unbelievably well, as did Maro and a couple of others. They talked about making sure we understand what Test-match level is and you can dominate some areas but if you don't build scoreboard pressure you can get into a situation like we did."

Conway did not feature in last year's Championship because of a head injury, although he never disclosed the nature of the issue.

Having turned 30 last year – and with other players bursting on the scene – there was every chance that his absence could have seen him fall down the pecking order.

Instead, he has become a mainstay of Andy Farrell's side. He started all three November Tests – scoring a hat-trick against Japan – and got the nod to start on Saturday.

The Dubliner justified his selection with a brace of tries which came in between Bundee Aki's opener and Garry Ringrose's effort which sealed the bonus point.

If Conway's second was a routine finish, his first required him to slide

across the line to ground the ball while at the same time making sure he did that before he was bundled into touch.

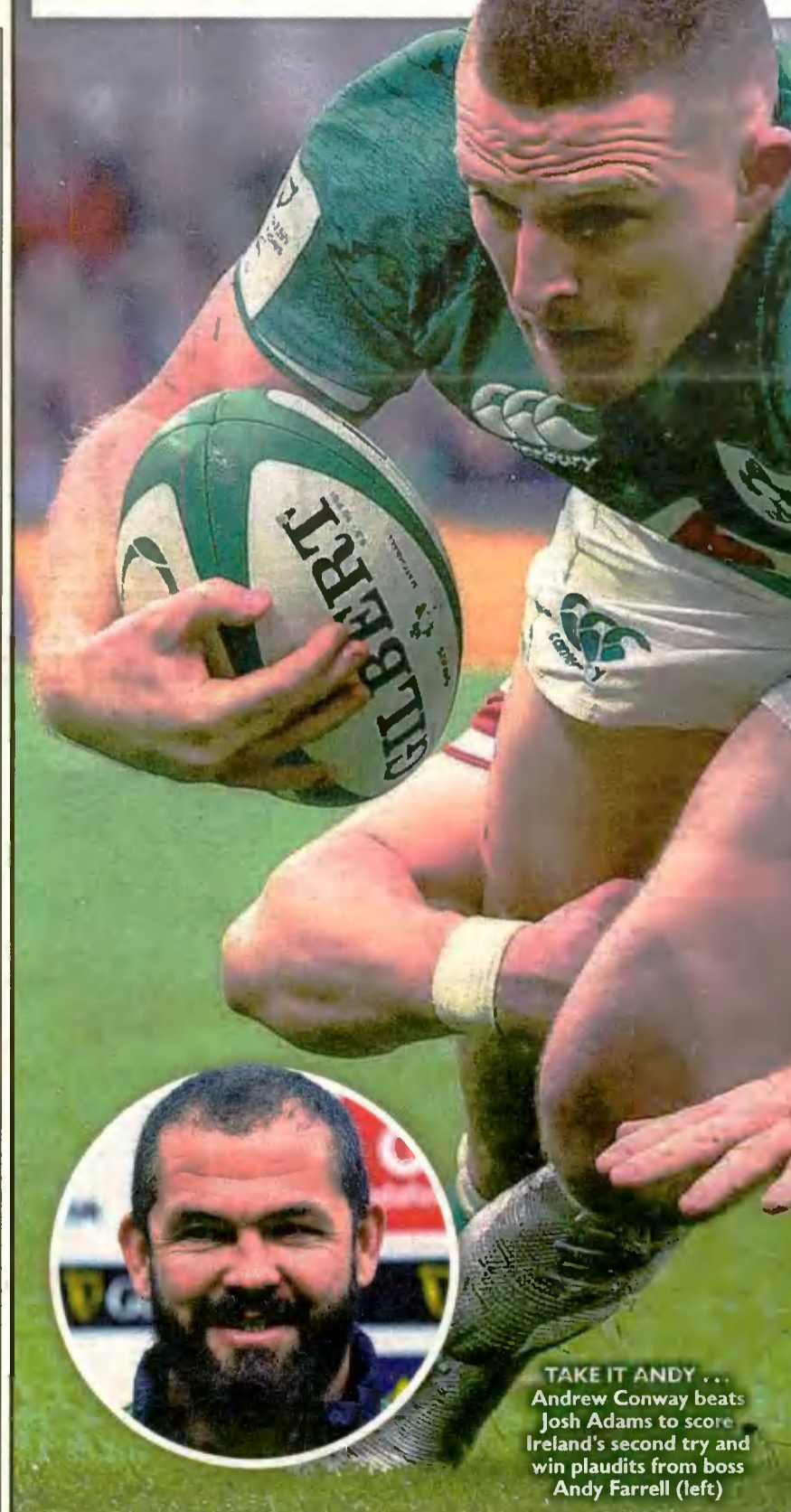
He managed it as he made it 15 tries from 28 caps before being taken off having felt ill earlier in the day.
