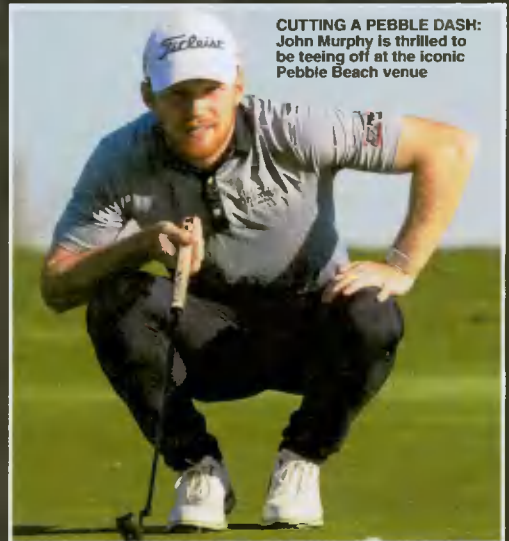

# MURPHY'S READY FOR THE BEACH

THE first golf tournament John Murphy was let stay up and watch on TV was Graeme McDowell's US Open triumph at Pebble Beach in 2010.

Murphy was 11 at the time and just under 12 years later, the Kinsale man will tee it up at the same venue tomorrow in his first PGA Tour start. "Graeme McDowell and Rory winning the US Open were the first two I stayed up for," smiled the Kinsale man.

Murphy, 23, decided to head out to California nine days ago. "It was a bit too gloomy at home to be golfing all day every day so I decided I'd like to come over and get ready in the best way possible, so I played Pebble, Monterey Peninsula, Spyglass," he smiled.

"It didn't really hit me until I was about to tee off at Pebble on Tuesday or Wednesday and they started putting up the 18th tee signs around the tee boxes and putting up all the fencing and stuff." "It was kind of when it really hit me, that I'm going to be playing a PGA Tour event here. "But I don't want to treat it differently to any other tournament. "It's going to be cool. There are people from back home who are

coming over, and there'll be a good Irish contingent. "I'm sure once I get off that first tee shot, I'll be fine." "The redhead made waves at another iconic venue, St Andrews, last year when he finished in the top 10 in the Alfred Dunhill Links.

That performance bagged him an invitation for this week's AT & T Pro-Am - which, like the Alfred Dunhill, is played over three courses. He is also playing the Byron Nelson in late May. He failed to earn full Challenge Tour rights in 2021 and is dependent on invites there. But he won't feel overawed this week, after all, he has already played golf with his childhood hero, Cork GAA great Brian Corcoran.

"I have a picture of him when I was maybe six or seven, he was signing the back of my shirt, so I showed it to him when we were playing golf and he got a good laugh out of it," grinned Murphy. "I am lucky enough to have played with some of the best players and I realised it is not a matter of hitting good shot after good shot, it is also a matter of if you can hit less bad shots out on tour," he said. "So it gave me comfort knowing that, certainly when I played with them I didn't feel like I was that far behind at all and the gaps are very minute at this point, so it's just trying to close those gaps in any way possible is what it is all about."
