NICHOLLS GOES FOR GALVIN

CHAMPION trainer Paul Nicholls fancies Galvin to land the Cheltenham Gold Cup two weeks today.

The Ditchet maestro does not have a runner in jump racing's blue riband, which he has won four times.
But he says: "I like Galvin. I always thought he was a Gold Cup horse after he won at Cheltenham last year. He stays, he's a good horse."
"I thought he was ideal for the race when he ran so well behind Frodon at Down Royal this season."
"Also, when he won at Leopardstown over Christmas he impressed me."
"He's progressive and unexposed. That's the one I would have a bet on."

Bankers
As for adding to his own 46 Festival winners, Nicholls might be light in numbers with just 12 to 14 runners.
But he believes he has three cracking chances with Bravemansgame, Bob and Co and Stage Star.
He said: "There's lots of nice chances in those

handicaps but not bankers, as those races are extremely hard to win."
"Stage Star runs in the Ballymore."
"He was a good bumper horse last year and was always going to be a better horse this year, winning all three of his novice hurdles."

Class
"You wouldn't know how good he could be. He needs to step up again but cannot do more than win."
"One of our best chances of the week, I would say."
"Also, I like Bob And Co in the St James's Place Hunter Chase."

Bravemansgame, heralded as the trainer's next Denman, oozed class when paraded at the Somerset yard yesterday.
"He's a fantastic looking horse and has done everything right, winning his four chases," said his trainer about his Brown Advisory contender. "He's already rated higher than Denman before he runs in the Cheltenham race that Denman won back in 2007."
"I would like to think next year he will be a King George VI and Gold Cup horse. He's got a lovely chance."
Nichols added: "When I first compared him to Denman, he'd just won the Challow, as Denman had."
"He's rated higher now than Denman was after he won the Brown Advisory. There's a lot of similarities in terms of what they've done, but you can't compare generations really."
"He can only be beaten what's put in front of him. It doesn't mean that one is better than the other, but he's certainly gone the right way anyway."

PRINCESS TO SWERVE DUBAI

PRINCESS ZOE is to bypass Dubai and will be aimed towards another tilt at the Gold Cup at Royal Ascot.
Trainer Tony Mullins has decided not to go for the Dubai World Cup at the end of this month following her run in the Red Sea Turf Handicap in Saudi Arabia tomorrow.
The ground in Riyadh was too quick for the seven-year-old mare and she could not live with the pace in the final quarter-mile and finished down the field

behind impressive winner Stay Foolish.
Mullins intends to give his stable star a prep run in the Vintage Crop Stakes at Navan on April 23 ahead of the Gold Cup, in which she was a fine second to Subjectivist last summer.

"She won't go to Dubai. I would imagine the plan at the moment is the Vintage Crop at Navan at the end of

April and train her then for the Ascot Gold Cup," said the County Kilkenny handler.
"It won't be ideal for her, but it's the only race to suit to give her a run and have her in fine form for Ascot."
Mullins reflected on Princess Zoe's run and reported her to be in good form on her return.
"The ground was too fast for her and she was on top of her head early, but we were afraid if we didn't have her up handy we might not be able to close."
