**ON THE ROPES**

**THE man who started it all, the incredible success story of Irish boxing was buried in Blaris Cemetry in Belfast yesterday morning.**

John McNally passed away last Monday at the age of 89 – a mere four months short of the 70th anniversary of his achievement of winning Ireland's first Olympic boxing medal.

Sixteen others have followed suit (Paddy Barnes going so twice) but there can only ever be one first.

McNally, who began his boxing with the Immaculate club before moving on to first St Mary's and then White City, still had three months left in his teens when he reached the bantamweight final at the Messuhalli in Helsinki in August 1952.

His opponent in the deciding bout was Pentti Hamalainen, a 22-year-old local southpaw who had won a bronze medal at flyweight in the previous year's European Championships in Milan.

**Host**

The final was on the last evening of the Games and the host nation still hadn't won a gold medal.

Finland broke its duck on a split decision. A year and a half later Hamalainen beat McNally more convincingly a second time – and in the National Stadium at that!

McNally, who had won his first Irish title by beating Liam Watson from the Holy Family club for the five and a half stone boys championship in the National Stadium in April 1947, had only one more amateur fight after the second loss to Hamalainen, beating Billy Scott from Glasgow in the Ulster Hall a dozen nights later.

Then seeking fresh challenges, he decided to turn professional.

He made his debut at the Kelvin Hall in Glasgow in early April 1954, just eight weeks after the war over Scotland. He stopped local Johnny Kenny inside two rounds and, over the next nine months, chalked up a further five wins.

Then, in March 1955, he suffered his first loss, being outpointed by Joe Quinn in a challenge for the Northern Ireland featherweight title in the King's Hall.

After another win, he was beaten for a second time just two months later, being brutally knocked out in seven rounds by Teddy Peckham in the chief support to Ray Farnoch's controversial win over Billy "Spinner" Kelly in Donnybrook Bus Depot.

**Mixed**

His results thereafter were decidedly mixed.

He ended Arthur Donnachie's perfect 10-0 record by knocking him out in less than a round in the King's Hall and drew with Dickie Hughes in Manchester but was himself counted out against Guy Garcia.

He suffered other inside-the-distance losses to Dave Coventry and, in a clash for the vacant Northern Ireland lightweight title, Peter Sharpe.

His last fight was at the Furrer Street Stadium in Middleborough in March 1961 when he stopped Johnny Nolan in the third round. He then hung up his gloves, ending his paid career with a disappointing record of 14-9 and two draws.

"I hated every minute of it because of the gangsters who hung around the sport. All they wanted was money," he said of his venture into the professional side of the sport.

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
