

It's Jamieson risky rewards

SCOTT JAMIESON has a two-shot lead at the ISPS Handa Championship in Spain after turning the screw down the stretch.

The Scot picked up five shots over the last five holes having close with an eagle three for a seven-under-par 63.

Finland's Tapio Puikkari is second on nine-under after a 67 gave him a two-shot advantage over another Scot, David Law, who posted 68.

Jamieson, whose sole DP World Tour victory came at the 2013 Nelson Mandela Championship, admitted he got lucky at the last when hitting his drive into the left rough.

He revealed: "I then hit a good recovery shot from a half-decent lie, getting it just short right of the green and holed from 30ft.

EMMA SENT BACK HOME

EMMA RADUCANU was knocked out of the Tennis Grand Prix last night as she suffered lower-back pain against world No 1 Iga Swiatek.

The 19-year-old needed a medical timeout early in the second set as she was defeated 6-4 6-4 in the quarter-finals in Stuttgart.

It was not a blockbuster but the British ace gave a decent account of herself against the 20-year-old Polish star.

Ever since she won the US Open last September in spectacular style, Raducanu has had a stop-start career, contending with numerous physical issues.

Rarely has she been 100 per cent fit and will hope the growing pains can soon end – and stop disrupting her progress.

After losing the first set in 42 minutes, she was broken in the second set's third game. It was then

that she called for a trainer and went off court for three minutes.

Raducanu, who will move to No 11 in the world rankings on Monday, had two break points in the 10th game of the second set – but Swiatek saved those and then served out the match.

Raducanu will hope for a swift recovery before the next event in Madrid.

Swiatek is the woman to beat on the WTA circuit right now – winning 21 matches in a row.

The former French Open champion plays Russian Liudmila Samsonova, 23, in the semi-finals as she eyes another clay-court title.

Swiatek said: "Playing here is never routine as the surface is really tricky – and I am using every minute to get to know it."

I'm no Twit

JUDD BLOCKS OUT THE CRITICS

JUDD TRUMP has vowed to avoid any damaging Twitter ding-dongs.

World No 21 Matthew Selt is in trouble with snooker disciplinary bosses after an Instagram exchange with a fan, during which he slagged off Ronnie O'Sullivan.

The Juddernaut has more than 200,000 followers on Twitter and has had his fair share of abuse from disgruntled betters.

Yet the Bristol potter tends not to get involved in any arguments and simply uses the block and mute buttons instead.

That said, he does admit to using one abusive message as inspiration when he won the world title three years ago.

Trump, 32, said: "I'm quite good at blocking and deleting rather than responding – like some of the other players. I never have a go back.

"Maybe when Twitter first came out, I might have said something. "I'm someone who can bite my tongue and hit the block button. I feel sorry for people making those comments. They are maybe upset with themselves. Obviously, they don't understand the amount of work that goes into being where you are.

"I'm not angry, I'm sorry for them, that they feel that way.

"There was someone during my world championship win, who I saved a message from and used it as motivation."

Of Selt's social media woes, Trump said: "Matt is such a strong personality. He probably didn't mean how it has come out.

"It is a bit unfair people can criticise you and you cannot say anything back. You just need to be a bit more careful with the choice of words."

Back on the baize, No 4 seed Trump battles Anthony McGill this afternoon in their Betfred World Snooker Championship last-16 tie.

It is first to 13 frames at the Crucible, a venue McGill loves.

And Trump added: "Anthony plays his best snooker at the World Championship. He's struggled a lot in the other events.

"Yet he feels at home in this event and is a player who quietly goes through the tournament. He's someone you have to watch out for. I need to improve my game and my scoring."

MARK WILLIAMS beat his protege Jackson Page, 20, at both cards and snooker.

Williams smashed his poker pal 13-3 and said: "We had dinner on Thursday and a game of cards. I even took £15 off him.

"I ain't a championship contender. I cannot play much better than that at my age. I cannot improve. I will try to stay at the top."
