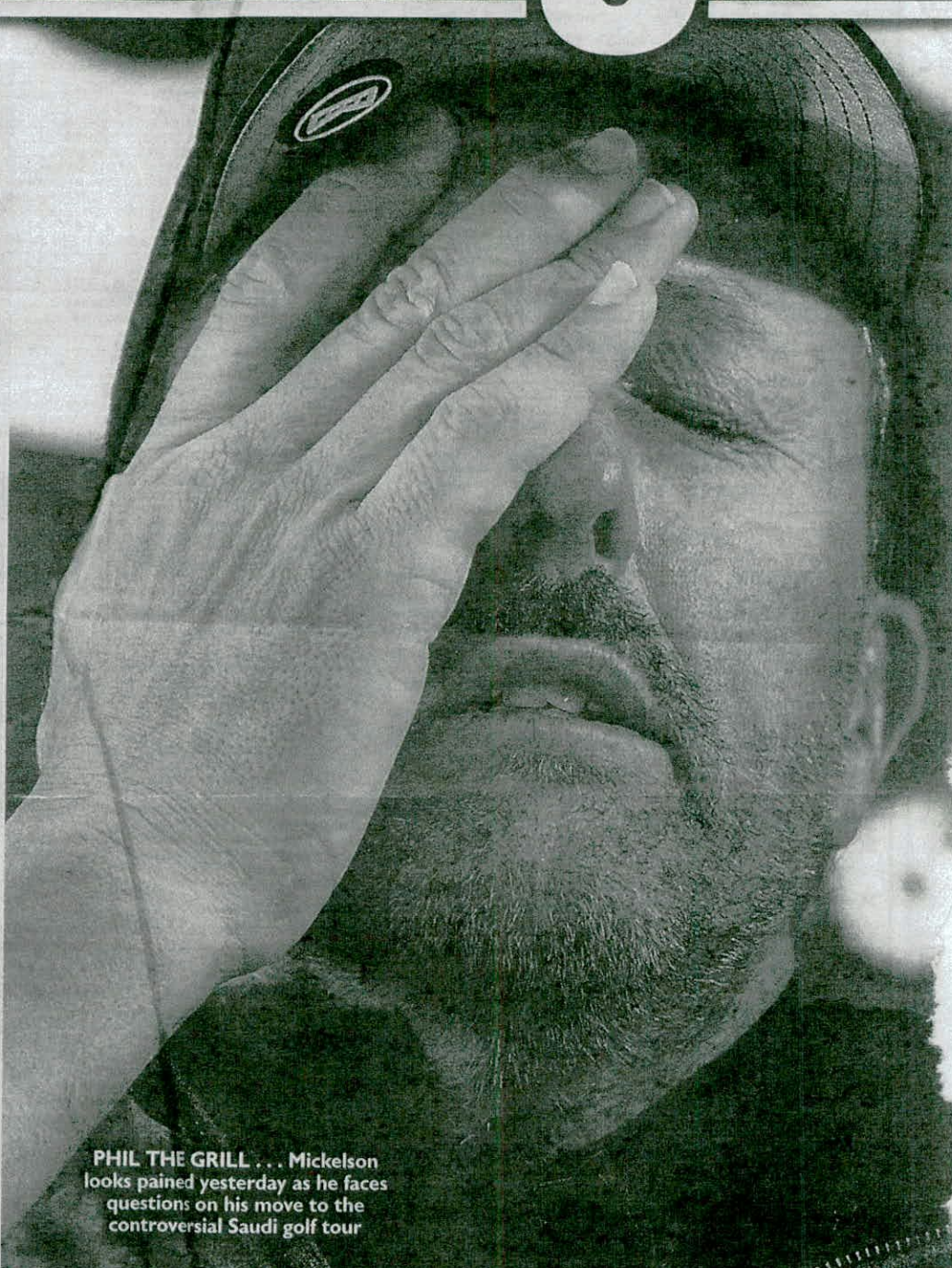

The LIV Golf tour has sparked civil war in the sport, with rebel players now facing PGA sanctions. "Wee-Mac" added: "It's a weird time in professional golf. "We are going to have to see how this plays out and see what the consequences are."

Westwood's 11 appearances make him Europe's most experienced Ryder Cup player, while Poulter is branded the 'Postman' because he always delivers. Both now face being banned - but Poulter, 46, said: "I'd like to think it wouldn't put that in jeopardy."

Westwood, who was expected to be named Europe's 2023 captain before ruling himself out, admitted: "The captaincy could be in jeopardy. "Both of us are members of the PGA Tour while we are in the European Tour. "That's had no effect in the past on people having been captains and LIV Golf is another tour, so why should it be any different?"

But the English pair were less comfortable when asked if there was "anywhere in the world" they would not play, including Vladimir Putin's Russia or South Africa under apartheid. Poulter said: "That's speculation. I don't need to answer that."
