

Lewis bound for Hollywood after Pitt stop

'I S THAT who I thought it was?' asked stunned staff at Mercedes' HQ in Northamptonshire, recently. 'It wasn't Brad Pitt, was it?'

Barely credible, but true. For the Hollywood A-lister was there to speak to Lewis Hamilton, and now the pair are making a star-studded Formula One film together.

Pitt (right), 58, will play a former driver who is lured out of retirement to mentor a budding racer and then, according to website *Deadline*, seeks a final glorious chapter as the younger man's team-mate.

Hamilton, 37, is helping produce the unnamed film but, speaking ahead of tomorrow's Azerbaijan Grand Prix, said he probably would not appear in it.

Apple have acquired the rights to the movie, which may also feature George Clooney as a rival 'fixer' to Pitt's character.

'We are working on the script and spending time with Brad is pretty epic,' explained Hamilton. 'You cannot say all the racing movies in the past

have been spectacular and that is something we want to change.

'It's about showing how great this sport is and also making sure that we keep the true racing spirit within the script, so that's part of my role. We don't want it to be c**p, which is probably why I'm not going to be a part of it!'

Hamilton stressed that he will not be silenced in his crusade for greater diversity after FIA president Mohammed Ben Sulayem appeared to question whether drivers should be so overt in expressing personal opinions on matters beyond the track.

Asked what Formula One should not become, Emirati Ben Sulayem responded: 'Niki Lauda and Alain Prost only cared about driving. Now, (Sebastian) Vettel drives a rainbow bicycle, Lewis is passionate about human rights and (Lando) Norris addresses mental health. Everybody has the right to think. To me, it is about deciding whether we should impose our beliefs over the sport all the time.'

Hamilton said: 'I heard Mohammed clarified things later, which is positive. But it doesn't stop us from doing what we are doing. I encourage all the drivers to be more outspoken on things they care about.'

On the track, Ferrari's Charles Leclerc took top spot in practice as Hamilton laboured to 12th.

Fresh from winning in Monte Carlo, and penning a new contract which will see him remain in Red Bull colours until 2024, Sergio Perez was quickest in the opening running of the weekend.

But the Mexican was gazzumped by Leclerc later in the day, trailing the Ferrari man by a quarter-of-a-second.

Ferrari and Red Bull continue to be the top of the class with world

champion Max Verstappen third in the order, three tenths back.

Fernando Alonso finished fourth for Alpine, almost a second slower than Leclerc, with Carlos Sainz fifth in the other scarlet car.

Hamilton heads into tomorrow's Baku race - the eighth round of 22 this season - already 75 points behind Verstappen, the equivalent of three victories.

And his Mercedes team continue to combat the problems which have wreaked havoc on their campaign as both Hamilton and team-mate George Russell suffered from heavy bouncing.

Hamilton said: 'It is so bumpy, I couldn't see the line. We're facing the same problems as the last race. We need to get our heads down and find solutions.'

Katie is put on hold as Serrano sets up MSG fight

AMANDA SERRANO will return to Madison Square Garden in August, confirmation that a rematch with Katie Taylor in Croke Park will not take place this year. Serrano's management company, Most Valuable Promotion, announced yesterday that Serrano and manager Jake Paul are to fight on the same bill in a Showtime TV pay-per-view production on August 6. Their opponents have not been named.

Taylor, who turns 36 next month, is two years older than Serrano and the longer the Puerto Rican and her management delay a rematch, the greater their chance of gaining revenge for the loss on points to the Bray woman back in May. Taylor's manager Eddie Hearn confirmed this week that the Serrano camp 'did not want' a rematch with Taylor this year.

Taylor may try to find an opponent to replace Serrano for a Croke Park fight this autumn but there is no-one who is as big a draw, which would make it a financial risk and could open the possibility of a smaller Irish venue.
