I wish to object to the proposed development on the following observations and grounds.

- 1. The height of the proposed development is out of character with the surrounding area. Being much taller than surrounding properties it would result in negative visual impact and blocking of light for these residences.
- 2. The scale of the proposed development is way too large for the location. The site is very close to residential properties and the traffic and operational noise generated could be of extreme annoyance to the occupants of these properties. Particularly if operated through the night which is a possibility if used as a distribution warehouse.
- 3. A pedestrian entrance through Hermitage Gardens will affect security and increase the possibility of unsocial behaviour for residents of Hermitage Park.
